Swim Lesson Placement

Enrolling your child in the appropriate level is critical for their success. Every effort should be made to select the appropriate class based on their age and skill level. Read the below swim level descriptions carefully. If you are still unsure of which level attend a Swim Level Assessment. If enrollment is made into a class that is not at the child's ability, space in another class cannot be guaranteed.

FREE Swim Level Assessment

Our trained staff will assess your child's ability and determine which level is most appropriate prior to registration. Pre-registration not required.

Swim Level Descriptions

Parent and Me (Level 1/2)

Ages: 6 Months - 3 Years

This course is designed for parent/child interaction. Course is taught as a combination class with the instructor presenting both skill levels during class. **NOTE**: Infants must wear a swim diaper under suits while in water.

Level 1 - Introduces basic skills to parents and children. Skills introduced include: water adjustment and entry, bubble blowing, underwater exploration, buoyancy on the front and back position, plus age-appropriate safety topics.

Level 2 - Builds on skills introduced in Level 1 and also introduces the following skills with assistance from parent: front and back glide, front kick, arm movement, submerging in a rhythmic pattern, rolling over, and age-appropriate safety topics.

Beginning Toddler

Ages: 3 - 5 Years

Designed to be a preschool age child's first experience in a pool without a caretaker. Introduces swimming and water safety skills. Must be able to follow directions. Skills taught include water adjustment, bubble blowing, underwater exploration, front and back floats, glides with support, kicking and alternate arm strokes and treading water.

Advanced Toddler

Ages: 3 - 5 Years

Course is designed to follow Beginning Toddler for children ages 3-5 years. Participant must be able to blow bubbles, front and back float unassisted for 5 seconds, submerge face without using goggles, and climb out of the pool without help. Participants must be able to listen and follow directions. Skills taught include entering water by jumping in, fully submerge and retrieve items, bobbing, front, jellyfish, and tuck floats, treading water, finning arm action on back, and age-appropriate safety topics.

Level 1 - Water Exploration

Ages: 5+ Years

Designed to be a beginning level course for children 5 and older. Participants will learn elementary skills including bubble blowing, under water exploration, introduction to front crawl, backstroke, back float and front float with support, kicking and alternate arm strokes, bobbing, entering and exiting the water, and age-appropriate safety topics.

Level 2 - Primary Skills

Ages: 5+ Years

Must have mastered Level 1 skills. Objective of this course is for the participant to successfully learn fundamental skills. Participant will learn to float without support and to recover to a vertical position. Other skills taught are glides, front arm motion, flutter kicks, rhythmic breathing, and age-appropriate safety skills. This level marks the beginning of true locomotion skills and adds to self-help and basic rescue skills.

Park Information

The City of Temecula's park system currently consists of 39 beautiful parks that are available for public and recreational use. Refer to page 48 for a complete park listing. The following is helpful information regarding park guidelines and rules:

Park Rules:

- Loitering in City parks is not permitted.
- Help keep our parks clean. Please do not litter.
- Appropriate use of handicapped parking will be monitored.
- Fire lanes must remain open at all times.
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times & please clean up after your dogs.
- Consumption of alcohol in the park system is prohibited.
- Flying balloons, planes, rockets, and fireworks are not permitted.
- Party jumps must be pre-approved. Call 694-6410 for information.
- Selling merchandise or providing services in City park sites or City recreational facilities without approval is prohibited.
- Overnight parking is prohibited at all park sites and facilities.
- For safety purposes, the use of private boats, powered model boats or watercraft
- of any kind is prohibited at the Temecula Duck Pond and Harveston Lake Park.



Veterans Memorial

Temecula Duck Pond, 28250 Ynez Rd.

Symbolically, on the eleventh day of the eleventh month at the eleventh hour in the year 2004, the City of Temecula humbly and proudly dedicated the "Letter's Home" A Veteran's Memorial at the Temecula Duck Pond. Artist Christopher Pardell created a true expression of a life-sized bronze sculpture of a soldier reflecting as he writes a letter home. As the uniformed soldier sits atop his bunker ready to defend, should the need arise, he takes a moment to pen a letter to a loved one.

The beautiful lake park setting also includes a sheltering tree that symbolizes the protection provided by those who selflessly serve our country. Annually, the tree blooms a beautiful yellow flower which historically signifies support for the men and women in the armed forces. The wall surrounding the sculpture provides a backdrop for the bunker and proudly displays actual "Letter's Home" from those who have served throughout our nation's history. A final element to the memorial is the "Path of Honor" which are engraved pavers leading to the sculpture that many of our citizens purchased to honor a loved one who has served our country. This memorial is for the men and women who had the courage to stand up for their beliefs answering the call of the nation and risking their lives to protect freedom. In 1956, President Eisenhower held a conference on citizen diplomacy and proposed that peace and prosperity could be fostered between people of different cultures by celebrating and appreciating their differences. Each relationship with our Temecula Sister City has grown and fostered many cultural and educational experiences for those who have traveled between the two cities. Hundreds of middle school and high school students, educators, local officials, and private citizens have traveled across the world to visit and partake in one another's culture. These city-to-city exchanges continue to bridge cultural, political, and socio-economic differences today and will continue to do so long into the future. Leidschendam-Voorbug, the Netherlands

They are on display to the public for citizens to visit as tokens of our friendship with the Dutch.

Daisen-Nakayama, Japan

Temecula and Daisen-Nakayama formed a sister city relationship in 1994. In honor of the 10th anniversary of our relationship a Japanese Friendship Garden and plaque was erected at the entrance of the Temecula Duck Pond. In May 2014, our friends from Daisen will be here to celebrate our 20 year anniversary with our Japanese sister city. We are planning an enhancement to the Japanese Garden. 



Trash & Maintenance Services



Storm Drains

The City of Temecula would like to remind residents of the City's storm water and pollution prevention requirements. When it rains, water flows from our streets and into our creeks. Flows then drain into the Santa Margarita River, which ultimately discharges into the Pacific Ocean. The City is committed to improving water quality by implementing programs that systematically reduce and eliminate pollutants from urban runoff before reaching our local creeks. Please join us in this commitment by considering some simple pollution prevention measures:

- · Use dry methods (raking, vacuuming, sweeping) for outdoor cleaning.
- Use rags or powdered absorbents to clean up spills.
- Dispose of pet waste, debris, and trash in trash bins, not in the gutter.
- Use a mop instead of a hose to clean areas when water is needed.
- Set irrigation timers to prevent over-watering. This runoff carries fertilizers, pesticides, and sediment into local creeks and harms their ecosystems.
- Do not hose down driveways, sidewalks, or gutters.

Other than rain water, it is illegal to send pollutants into our streets, gutters, storm drains, or any waterway. If you see an illegal discharge, please report it by calling us at 951-694-6411. Street Sweeping

Please be a good neighbor and remember not to park on residential streets on trash pick-up day and street sweeping day. Residential streets are swept the day after trash pick-up day. Observing this simple request helps keep Temecula's neighborhoods looking their best!



City Wide Clean Up Day

CR&R Inc. and the City of Temecula will be co-sponsoring the bi-annual Citywide Clean-up on April 26, 2014. All City residents may dispose of e-waste, used motor oil, antifreeze, vehicle batteries, green waste, and bulky items. This service is free to Temecula residents. (ID is required). Maintenance Division

The Maintenance Division is committed to ensuring an aesthetically pleasing and healthy city by providing safe, clean public areas. Paint Collection

The California Paint Stewardship Program offers 4 locations in Temecula to take leftover paint. Interior and exterior architectural coatings sold in containers of 5 gallons or less are accepted at no additional charge from residents and certain businesses. Aerosol products (spray cans) and specialty coatings are not allowed. Drop off sites may only collect certain quantities at one time. ABOP Center

Riverside County offers weekly collection of antifreeze, vehicle and household batteries, oil (and filters), and paint (latex only) at the ABOP Center.

Holiday Schedule Trash Pick-Up

On holidays your trash collection will be delayed by one day. If your normal trash day is Monday, your trash will be collected on Tuesday, etc. If your normal trash day is Friday, your trash will be collected on Saturday. Holidays will also affect the street sweeping schedule. If the holiday occurs on Saturday or Sunday, your trash collection & street sweeping services may not change. Holidays are New Year's Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Transfers and Refunds
